Delegates will experience how a focus on cultural understanding in all schemes of work can enhance teaching and learning at all stages developing a sense of

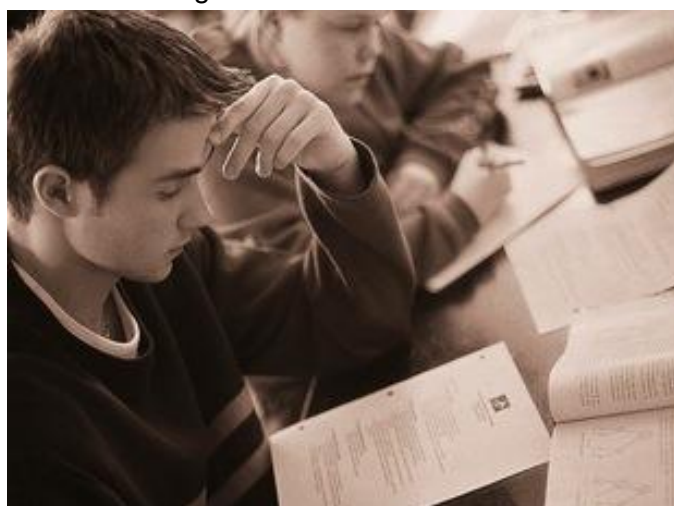

London Underground:

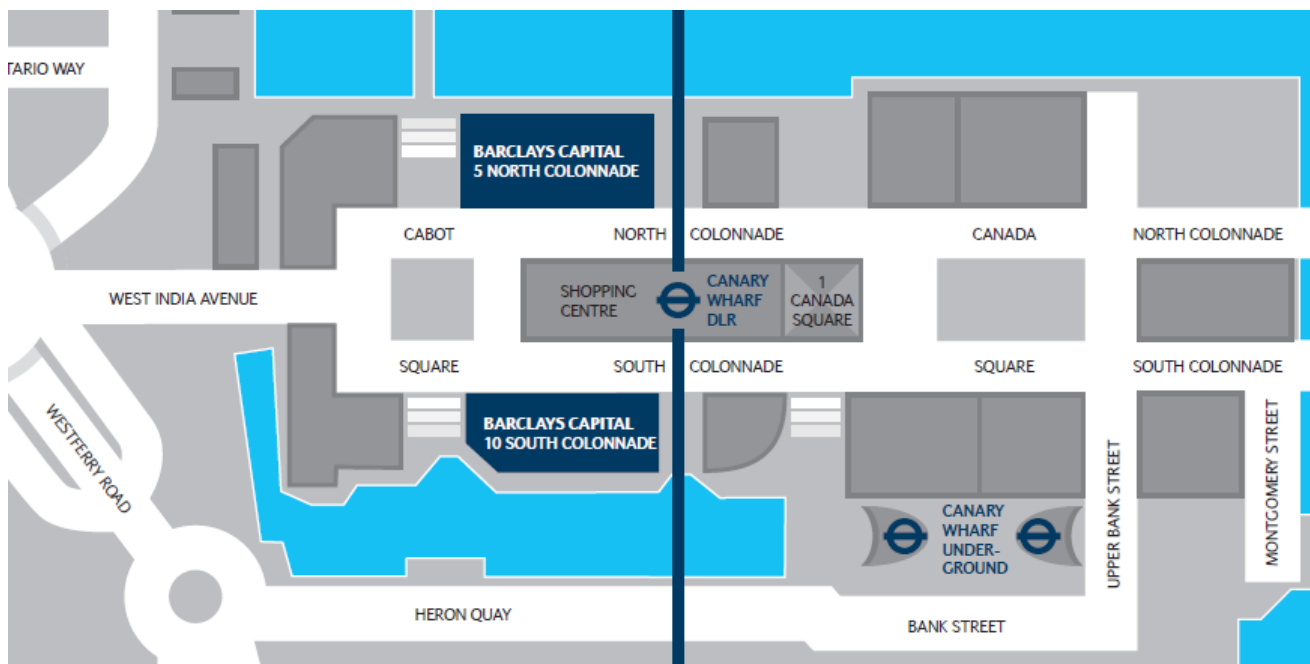
Canary Wharf Station
